Presentation of the Preliminary assessment report on the risks associated to climate and environmental changes in the Mediterranean region

The Mediterranean Basin is undergoing strong environmental and socioeconomic changes. Having experienced a rise in temperature levels above the global average, the region is at eminent risk of experiencing significant water shortages, productivity decline, losing significant marine and land ecosystems, ocean acidification, and compromised coastal infrastructure among others.

While the impacts of climate change will be strongly felt on both shores of the Mediterranean in economic and social terms, not to mention geopolitical repercussions, Southern and Eastern Mediterranean countries will be more vulnerable to such impacts.

During this event, the current state of play and risks associated with climate and environmental changes in the Mediterranean will be discussed by scientists and policy makers, aiming to establish an effective science policy interface with regards to climate change in the region.

Towards this end, an open and independent international network of Mediterranean Experts on Climate and Environmental Change (MedECC) had been launched in July 2015 to gather, update and consolidate the best scientific knowledge on these issues, and render it accessible to policy-makers and key stakeholders.

The dialogue between scientists and decision-makers is facilitated by the Secretariat of the Union for the Mediterranean and the Mediterranean Action Plan of the United Nations Environment Programme, through its Plan Bleu Regional Activity Center, which support the MedECC network in the framework of their agreement.

This event will provide an opportunity for scientists and stakeholders to discuss the main vulnerabilities in the Mediterranean region, as well as its resilience to climate change.

The preliminary assessment report on climate and environmental changes in the Mediterranean region will be available during the event, including science-backed recommendations for decision-makers on how to address them.


